1. Welcome & Introductions

Carol Monaghan MP welcomed parliamentarians and guests to the APPG's meeting in Westminster.

1.1 Election of Chair

All parliamentarians present re-elected Carol Monaghan MP as Chair.

1.2 Election of Vice-Chairs and Officers

All parliamentarians present re-elected Baroness Finlay of Llandaff, Stephen Metcalfe MP, Debbie Abrahams MP, and Sharon Hodgson MP as Vice-Chairs.

1.3 Election of Officers

All parliamentarians present re-elected Fleur Anderson MP and Jason McCartney MP as Officers, as well as electing Marion Fellows MP as a new Officer.

2. Any Other Business

Due to votes taking place in Parliament during the meeting, Carol Monaghan MP proposed that Any Other Business be discussed before the presentations.

- 2.1 Carol flagged her upcoming meeting with the Quadrum Institute, whose research involves ME, and extended the invite to the parliamentarians present.
- 2.2 Carol highlighted that the DecodeME survey continues to seek participants and urged parliamentarians to share details on their social media platforms.
- 2.3 Carol raised the question of recording and livestreaming meetings of the APPG. It was agreed that every effort would be made to record and make available the presentations made to the APPG.
- 2.4 Minutes from the AGM were formally approved.

4.1 Prof. David Strain made a presentation to the meeting on support in clinical settings, highlighting the trends in relation to cases of severe ME.

5.1 Anna Gregorowski outlined the structure, objectives, and vision of British Association of Clinicians in ME/CFS (BACME).

6. The Experiences of Children with Severe ME/CFS

6.1 Sonya Chowdhury presented a case study of the experience of a child suffering from severe ME.

7.1 Following the presentations, the parliamentarians present took part in a question & answer session.

The meeting ended at 5pm.

- The difficulty of treating severe ME given that hospitals often aren't attuned to patients' requirements
- The hope that current research into Long Covid will incorporate other postviral syndromes and inform research on ME

- The ME APPG will look into potentially liaising with the Long Covid APPG
